Tahoe provides unparalleled outdoor recreation experiences, but managing the surge in visitation in the busy months creates challenges for our communities and the environment.



THE FOREST

According to a report from Vibrant Planet, the Tahoe Basin has 22 million more trees than a healthy forest should. With this significant overcrowding putting the region at risk of catastrophic wildfire, the Tahoe Fund has made forest health our number one priority.

We are investing in promising new ideas and innovative pilot projects through our Smartest Forest Fund that increase the pace and scale of fuels reduction and help lower the risk of catastrophic wildfire.



THE LAKE

External stressors like aquatic invasive species, algae, and wildfires are creating new challenges for Lake Tahoe's famous blue waters.

We are helping to improve the health of the Lake by restoring high-priority watersheds, preventing and controlling aquatic invasive species, and reducing sediment and pollutants from entering the Lake.



TAHOE FUND PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS





INCLINE FIRE SMART COMMUNITY PILOT

The I ande Fund convened partners for an innovative pilot project in Incline Village aimed at making a local neighborhood the most fire-ready community in Tahoe. The Incline Fire Smart Community pilot is using technologies and data-driven strategies to execute a series of connected wildfire mitigation efforts across sublic lands utility. mitigation efforts across public lands, utility corridors and a neighborhood of 228 homes

NORTHSTAR COMMUNITY SERVICES **DISTRICT BIOMASS-TO-HEAT PLANTS**

The Tahoe Fund provided a joint grant with Vail Resorts-made possible by dollar donations from guests—to help build a biomass plant that will provide heat to the Village at Northstar using wood waste from nearby forest health treatments. This plant will replace six natural-gas-fired boilers, reducing emissions and furthering our goals of preventing catastrophic wildfire.



FORESTRY PROGRAM **SCHOLARSHIPS**

The key to increasing the pace and scale The key to increasing the pace and scale of forest restoration work is a robust and growing workforce. For the third year in a row, the Tahoe Fund has offered scholarships to students in Lake Tahoe Community College's Forestry and Fire Academy programs. We also provided a private match to hire an administrator to oversee student success in both student success in both



THE LAKE



FORMER MOTEL 6 DEMOLITION

The California Tahoe Conservancy is demolishing the former Motel 6 building, adjacent restaurant and parking lot in the Upper Truckee Meadow to restore the sensitive land beneath. After providing initial funds for the acquisition of this property, the Tahoe Fund raised \$200,000 to move this project into the demolition phase.



TAYLOR-TALLAC AQUATIC **INVASIVE SPECIES REMOVAL**

This collaborative effort to remove 17 acres of invasive plants in the Taylor and Tallac creeks and marshes is the largest Aquatic Invasive Species (AB) project in the Tahoe Basin. The Tahoe Fund provided \$100,000 to close the funding gap to install the bottom barriers, which have now successfully eradicated one of the hisbest concentrations of invasives.



72-MILE CLEANUP & HOTSPOTS

The first ever scuba cleanup of all 72 miles of Lake Tahoe's shoreline was completed by Clean Up The Lake, thanks to major support from Tahoe Blue Vodka, Vail Resorts and more than 135 Tahoe Fund donors. The team pulled out 29,000 pounds of trash from the Lake, and they are back in the water removing debris from hotspots.

THE EXPERIENCE



FOREST SERVICE RESTROOM MURALS

The Tahoe Fund teamed up with the Forest Service to hire local artists to paint murals inside restrooms at four popular recreation sites around the Tahoe Basin. Featuring sweeping views of Tahoe, magnified depictions of native species, and more, these murals are inspiring people to take better care of our environment.



MEEKS RIDGE TRAIL

The Tanoe Area Mountain Biking Associatic (TAMBA) is building a 4.5-mile multi-use trail that will connect the Meeks Bay area to the Lost Lake Trail, creating a new 10-mile loop for hikers and bikers on Lake Tahoe's West Shore. The Tahoe Fund raised \$100,000 for a paid crew to build the harder to access segments of trail at history advantage.



EMERALD BAY TRANSIT PILOT

Beginning in July, parking will be banned along the highway in Emerald Bay for the first time ever. A new shuttle system funded by the Tahoe Fund and the League to Save Lake Tahoe will offer an alternative

TAHOE XC TRAILHEAD RELOCATION

Tahoe XC welcomes over 20,000 visitors on their year-round groomed and multi-use trails. Now, they need our help to relocate their popular trailhead and provide easier access for outdoor adventures.
