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DEAR TAHOE FUND FRIENDS,

WE ARE PROUD TO PRESENT our Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Annual Report. As you'll see in this report, last year was full of transformational change for Lake Tahoe and for the Tahoe Fund.

Our Board of Directors and staff spent much of the year working on a refreshed Strategic Plan. After revisiting our goals to ensure we are responding to shifting needs in the region, we've honed our focus to three areas: The Forest, The Lake, and The Experience. We are prioritizing projects that reduce the risk of catastrophic wildfire, improve the health of the lake, and make it easier to get around, enjoy, and take care of Lake Tahoe.

Within each of these three focus areas, we have made substantial progress on transformational projects, alongside our partners.

After providing funding to help the California Tahoe Conservancy acquire the former Motel 6 property and surrounding 31 acres within the Upper Truckee Marsh, we raised \$200,000 to demolish the existing buildings on-site. We remain committed to transforming this sensitive wetland into a healthy filtration system for Lake Tahoe, and are excited to support the restoration phase of this project.

At the start of this last fiscal year, we demonstrated how BurnBot's suite of remote-operated tools are helping remove excess fuel from our forests. Since then, we've been hard at work bringing together wildfire experts, technology companies, energy providers, and

nonprofits to revolutionize the way we are creating wildfire-resilient communities, with the goal of replicating this approach across Tahoe and the West.

Work is also underway to expand the East Shore Trail, making it easier and safer to access recreation along State Route 28. In addition to new and expanded parking lots, we are collaborating with our partners to help design, fund and build the next eight miles of path to Spooner Summit, starting with the next two miles of trail from Sand Harbor to Secret Harbor.

Although these are our major projects, they are just a few examples of the work accomplished over the last year. In total, we granted over \$1.7 million to 60-plus projects, and helped leverage nearly \$52 million in public funds—that's more than ever before.

The unwavering commitment of our Stewardship Circle members and project donors powers everything we do at the Tahoe Fund. It's your support that enables us to be a catalyst for transformational change and ensure that Lake Tahoe is a place for all to enjoy.

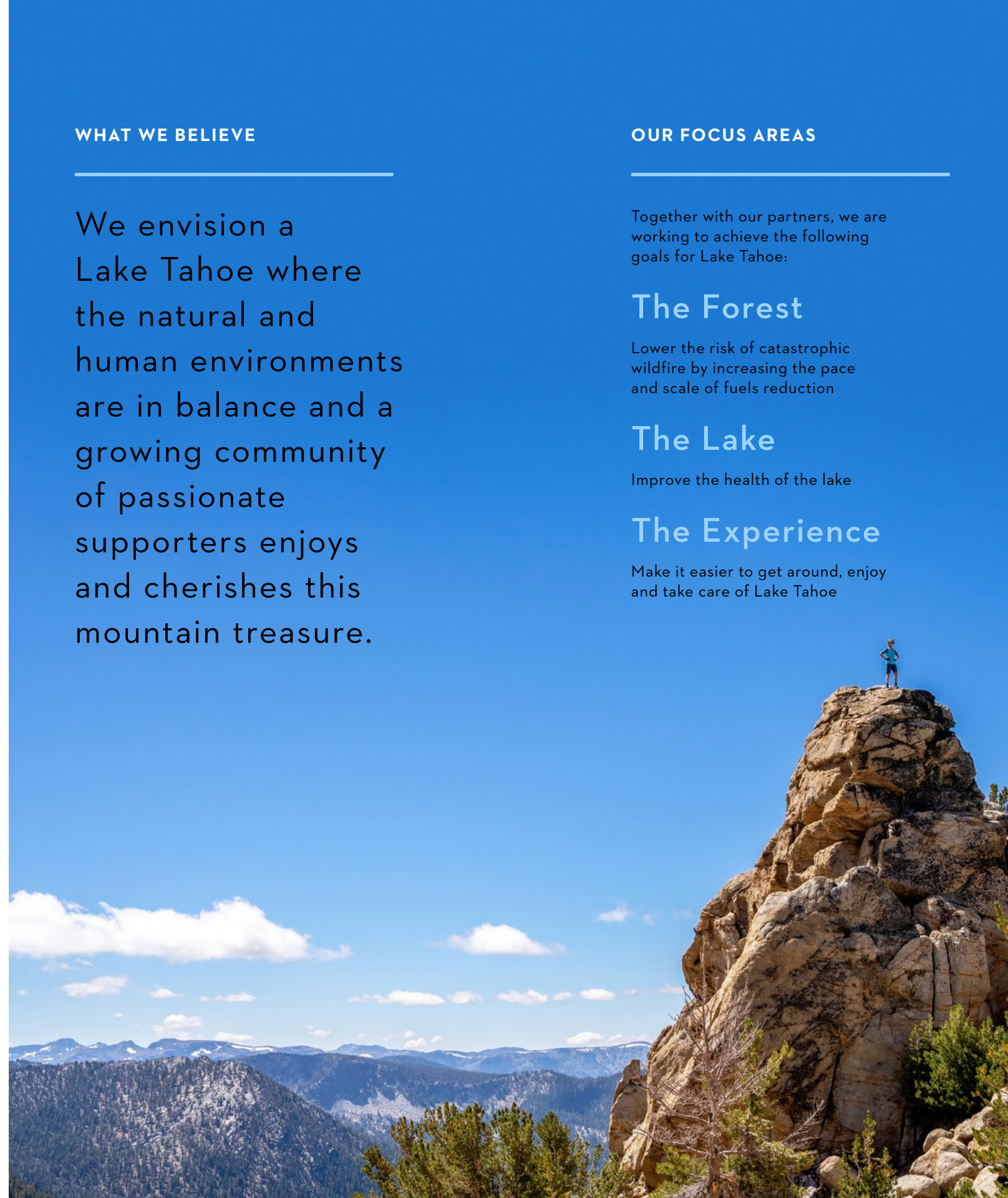

PROJECT SPOTLIGHT: LAKE TAHOE COMMUNITY COLLEGE'S FORESTRY PROGRAM

Building the Future of the Forestry Workforce

THE KEY to increasing the pace and scale of forest restoration work is a robust and growing workforce. Over the next five years, forestry management occupations are projected to have more than 200 annual job openings in the greater Sacramento region alone.

Lake Tahoe Community College's Forestry Education & Job Placement Program teaches students how to assist with forest management, planning, and implementation work. Graduates of the program are prepared for careers with

Tahoe-based employers, including CAL FIRE, the USDA Forest Service, the California Tahoe Conservancy, the Tahoe Resource Conservation District, private forestry contractors, and other agencies that are part of the Tahoe Fire and Fuels Team.

For three years running, the Tahoe Fund has provided scholarships for students in the program, and recently awarded a grant to support the program administrator to ensure student success.

THE LAKE

EXTERNAL STRESSORS like aquatic invasive species, algae, and wildfires are creating new challenges for Lake Tahoe's famous blue waters.

We are helping to improve the health of the Lake by restoring high-priority watersheds, preventing and controlling aquatic invasive species, and reducing sediment and pollutants from entering the Lake.

PROJECT SPOTLIGHT: TAYLOR TALLAC AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES REMOVAL

Tackling the Largest Invasive Plant Removal Project in Tahoe

TAHOE'S LARGEST invasive species removal project to date, which began three years ago with the installation of large tarps across Taylor and Tallac creeks and marshes on the south shore of Lake Tahoe, is now complete. Known as bottom barriers, these tarps are designed to block all sunlight and starve invasive plants. The barriers successfully eradicated 17 acres of Eurasian watermilfoil—one of the highest concentrations of invasive species anywhere around the lake.

The Tahoe Fund provided \$100,000 to close the funding gap to install the bottom barriers, with support from the Merrill Family Foundation. This was a major collaborative effort among several project partners, including the USDA Forest Service Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit, Tahoe Regional Planning Agency, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Army Corps of Engineers, Bureau of Land Management, the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, and Marine Taxonomic Services.

THE EXPERIENCE

TAHOE PROVIDES unparalleled outdoor recreation experiences, but managing the surge in visitation in the busy months creates challenges for our communities and the environment.

We are working to make it easier to get around, enjoy and take care of Lake Tahoe by investing in a sustainable trail system, finding innovative ways to reduce traffic congestion on busy days, and improving access to recreation opportunities, especially for underserved communities.

PROJECT SPOTLIGHT: FOREST SERVICE RESTROOM MURALS

Inspiring Stewardship Through Art at Tahoe Recreation Sites

VISITORS TO popular recreation sites in Lake Tahoe are greeted with a surprise when they step into the restroom facilities. Instead of blank walls inside the vault toilets, people now find beautiful murals painted by local artists through a project led by the USDA Forest Service Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit (LTBMU) and the Tahoe Fund.

In 2024, the LTBMU and the Tahoe Fund put out a call for local artists to “beautify” the blank

interiors of these restrooms with the goal of inspiring better stewardship of the environment. Five local artists were selected and painted murals that illustrate the breathtaking landscape of Lake Tahoe and highlight native plants and animals, delighting visitors and locals alike. Paint for the murals was generously supplied by Kelly Brothers Painting.

An applied research effort with the University of Nevada, Reno to understand the rapid Whitebark Pine mortality in the Basin, and equip land managers with up-to-date data so they can tailor forest health treatments accordingly.
