



TAHOE FUND PROJECT PORTFOLIO

Dollar Creek Bike Path

Granted: \$47,00 Partners: Placer Country

DOLLAR CREEK BIKE PATH is a 2.2 mile

section of the Lake Tahoe Bikeway that will one day circumnavigate the entire Lake. This section expands the trail that currently leads from Tahoe City up to Dollar Hill. When complete, there will be more than 25 miles of contiguous Class 1 bike path from Tahoma to Carnelian Bay, allowing users to explore the natural area as well as the local shops and eateries without ever getting into a car.

The project will include three new areas to stop and enjoy the scenery, benches, picnic tables, bike racks,

and interpretive panels that will call attention to interesting environmental information about the trail.

Rubicon/Lighthouse Trail Restoration

Granted: \$45,000 Partners: California Department of Parks and Recreation

THE RUBICON TRAIL is one of the most iconic in the Tahoe Basin. Granite boulders reach down to the crystal blue waters below, while hikers can take in the panoramic vistas of Lake Tahoe from the West Shore. A section of the trail is currently challenging to navigate due to extreme steepness. This steepness also causes major trail erosion that ends up harming the trail and depositing sediment into the Lake.

State Parks has a plan to reroute this section of the trail to make it a more enjoyable trail to explore





without the current erosion issues. With the support of private donors, will help create a wonderful new section of trail for all to enjoy. The project also includes restoration of the original lighthouse structure.

Taylor Creek Overlook

Granted: \$25.000 Partner: US Forest Service, Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit

TAYLOR CREEK is the most popular interpretive center in the Tahoe Basin. Visitation spikes in the Fall, when the Kokanee salmon begin spawning up the creek. Throngs of visitors, young and old, rush to the creek's edge to see the waters turn alive with the bright red fish. Not surprisingly, so do the bears. Unfortunately, there is currently no proper way to responsibly protect the salmon and bears from the visitors, putting all three in danger.

The Tahoe Fund is working with the US Forest Service to build a new overlook at Taylor Creek that



will provide a wonderful viewing location that will also significantly lower the issue of human-bear conflicts.

Thanks to Tahoe Blue Vodka, every donation was matched dollar-for-dollar to meet the campaign goal.

Generation Green

Granted: \$25,000 Partners: US Forest Service, Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit; Great Basin Institute

THE TAHOE FUND BELIEVES strongly in the need for environmental stewardship of the Lake Tahoe Region to help ensure the long-term preservation of the Lake among our current and next generations. The magnificent environment of Tahoe creates a wonderful opportunity to create lifelong environmental stewards in the Basin and beyond.

Generation Green is a work-study program that enables under-served youth from the local community to intern with the US Forest Service for a summer. During the internship, the high school-aged children form a Forest Service work crew and help build trails,



restore watersheds, improve Forest Service visitor areas and learn about leadership and teamwork. Many students that complete the program go on to become full-time employees of the US Forest Service after college.

Sand Harbor Electric Utility Vehicle

Granted: \$5,000 Partner: Nevada Division of State Parks

SAND HARBOR is the most visited park in the entire Nevada State Park system, with over 800,000 annual visitors. People come to explore the beautiful white sand beaches and towering boulders. Keeping the park beautiful while accommodating all of these visitors requires a lot of work from the park staff. To help make their job easier, the Tahoe Fund awarded a grant to help acquire an electric sport utility vehicle for use around the park.

Tahoe In Depth

Granted: \$5,000 Lead Agency: Tahoe Regional Planning Agency

TAHOE IN DEPTH is a news publication that aims to inspire environmental understanding and stewardship at Lake Tahoe. The purpose of Tahoe In Depth is to give homeowners, landowners, visitors and policy-makers clear, straightforward and interesting information about the Lake Tahoe environment—from successful restoration to ongoing challenges. The goal is to help people better understand the work being done to restore Tahoe's clarity and the role they can play in helping reach that outcome. The publication explores the natural and cultural history of the Tahoe Basin while providing balanced, reliable information on a wide spectrum of scientific and planning efforts under way to protect Lake Tahoe's unique scenic and ecological qualities.






UC Davis State of the Lake Report

Partner: UC Davis Granted: \$5,000

THIS ANNUAL REPORT is essential reading for the latest information on the health of Lake Tahoe, but when budget cuts jeopardized its production, the Tahoe Fund stepped in to close the funding gap. The annual State of the Lake Report published by UC Davis, Tahoe is intended to inform non-scientists about how natural variability and human activity affect the Lake's clarity, physics, chemistry, and biology.







TAHOE ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION MISSION PLANNING

WORKING ON THE Take Care campaign, the Tahoe Fund has recognized a need for better stewardship of Tahoe. To help solve this problem, the Tahoe Fund applied for a grant from the California Tahoe Conservancy to do environmental education mission planning for the region.

With this grant funding, the Tahoe Fund hired Global Studios, a consulting arm of the San Francisco-based Exploratorium, to help bring together stakeholders from nonprofits, public

Over the course of nine months, the group of stakeholders held five workshops to identify the core issue, develop a collective vision and mission, and to select a target audience. Environmental education is happening around Lake Tahoe, but there is an opportunity to enhance visitor engagement with a unified message and greater collaboration.

Vision:

Tahoe is an environmental success story and a global role model for sustainability

Mission:

The purpose of this initiative is to connect people with Tahoe to further a culture of stewardship and sustainability

Target Audience:

The focus will be on people who spend more than less time in Tahoe, and who have more interest in learning about Tahoe's environment.

> agencies and the business sector to develop a common vision and mission for environmental education.

The final report included three recommendations: + A paradigm shift in how environmental education organizations work together. Instead of coordinating efforts, the new way forward must be collaborative.

Collective programing across the region to help tie all efforts together.

• A new floating barge discovery center that would give people a place to learn about Tahoe's environment that would rotate around the Lake throughout the year.



INTRODUCING THE ENVIRONMENTAL VENTURE TRUST

THE ENVIRONMENTAL VENTURE TRUST is a new approach to philanthropy in Lake Tahoe. Similar to a traditional venture capital fund, the Tahoe Fund Environmental Venture Trust will provide seed funding for a variety of innovative early-stage environmental projects that will help solve the environmental challenges facing Lake Tahoe. The returns will be purely philanthropic.

Based on our experience, we know that many worthwhile projects require initial seed funding to put them in a strong position to receive significantly more funding down the road. By providing early-stage funding we can help kick start innovative pilot projects and get new projects off the ground.

Risk is inherently involved in venture funding, but the rewards can be incredible. Through our Projects Committee, we will closely vet new project ideas utilizing the following principles:

• The greatest possibility to improve the Tahoe environment and to attract significantly more funds in the future.

• Projects deemed to have good potential that have no other source of funding for this early-stage.

• To avoid projects that could be perceived as controversial or that duplicate any other project resources in the Tahoe Basin.

The seed investments will be modest in size. We will look for projects with great capacity for leverage of the initial seed funds through future public funding sources. It is possible as the projects advance they could also be considered for greater fundraising efforts by the Tahoe Fund.

Our first investment is a UV Light Pilot Project that is analyzing the use of UVC light to treat aquatic invasive weeds in Lake Tahoe. Our \$5,000 investment helped secure \$260,000 in public funding to begin the pilot in Summer 2017.

This is just one initiative of the Tahoe Fund, as we continue to inspire the private community to support shovel-ready projects around the Tahoe Basin.

LICENSE PLATE PROGRAM

THE TAHOE FUND continued to promote the sale and renewal of Tahoe license plates with the popular Plates for Powder program that awards new plate buyers with lift tickets to area resorts. Over 96% of the fees from plate purchases and


renewals go to Tahoe's public environmental agencies, the California Tahoe Conservancy and the Nevada Division of State Lands, to fund hiking and biking trails, and watershed restoration projects around the Basin.




