DEAR TAHOE FUND FRIENDS,

WE ARE PROUD TO PRESENT our Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Annual Report. As you'll see in this report, last year was full of transformational change for Lake Tahoe. Our partners throughout the region have rallied together around projects that are shifting the way we get things done: speeding up forest health treatments, undertaking large-scale restoration projects, and revolutionizing how we manage recreation and tourism.

Earlier this year, we joined forces with a handful of other Tahoe organizations to provide critical funding for the California Tahoe Conservancy's acquisition of the Motel 6 property and surrounding 31 acres within the Upper Truckee River watershed. This was the first step in one of the most important restoration projects in Lake Tahoe's history. We remain committed to transforming this sensitive wetland into a healthy filtration system for Lake Tahoe, and are excited to support the next phase of the project: demolishing the existing buildings on-site.

In the spring, we demonstrated how innovative technology can improve how we handle forest health treatments in Tahoe. During a three-day pilot in Incline Village, BurnBot showcased its remote mastication tools, which remove excess trees, bushes, and other forest debris 10 times faster than traditional methods. This allows crews to complete fuels reduction projects more safely and in a fraction of the time, with less impact to the environment. The team completed a 22-acre treatment in just three days, making the landscape healthier and more resilient to wildfire.

We've also seen the power of collaboration, with the region's first ever Destination Stewardship Plan bringing together land managers, business owners, public agencies and nonprofits around a shared vision for the future of our Lake. The core of this vision is taking better care of our environment for all to enjoy. That sentiment should sound familiar-it's also the heart of our mission at the Tahoe Fund. Already, this new plan has redefined how we manage outdoor recreation and tourism and the results speak for themselves: less litter, better access to beaches, and more microtransit options.

These projects are only some examples of what we've accomplished alongside our partners over the last year. In total, we granted over \$1.4 million to 50-plus projects in our five focus areas: forest health, lake clarity, sustainable recreation, stewardship, and transportation.



PROJECT SPOTLIGHT: TRUCKEE-TAHOE BURNBOT PILOT

Bringing Innovation to Forest Health Treatments

BURNBOT'S remote mastication tools remove excess trees, bushes, and other forest debriswhich serve as fuel for wildfire-10 times faster than traditional methods. This allows crews to complete restoration projects more safely and in a fraction of the time, with less impact to the environment. During a live demonstration in Incline Village, the team completed a 22-acre fuels reduction treatment in just three days.

This pilot project received a grant through the Tahoe Fund's Smartest Forest Fund, and was also supported by the Martis Fund, Tahoe Truckee Community Foundation, Lake Tahoe Restoration Act, Tahoe Fire & Fuels Team, North Lake Tahoe Fire Protection District, Tahoe Resource Conservation District, and the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency.



PROJECT SPOTLIGHT: FORMER MOTEL 6 ACQUISITION

Transforming the Upper Truckee River Watershed

THE UPPER TRUCKEE RIVER MARSH is one of the largest filtration systems for Lake Tahoe, catching sediment and debris before it flows into the Lake. The former Motel 6 building sits on top of the Upper Truckee River watershed, negatively impacting the native habitat of the marsh and by extension, the Lake's clarity and health.

With support from the Tahoe Fund and numerous other partners, the California Tahoe Conservancy purchased the former Motel 6 property and surrounding 31 acres. The Tahoe Fund is raising \$200,000 to support the removal of the old buildings and help transform the sensitive wetland into a healthy filtration system for Lake Tahoe.

PROJECT SPOTLIGHT: ECHO LAKES TRAIL RESTORATION

Tackling Major Trail Work in **Desolation Wilderness**

THE TAHOE RIM TRAIL winds through Desolation Wilderness, one of the most popular places for outdoor recreation in the Lake Tahoe region. Last year, the section of trail from Echo Lakes to Lake Aloha had over 2,000 trail users a week between June and September. This high usage, coupled with erosion and extreme weather events, left the trail in desperate need of restoration.

The Tahoe Fund partnered with the Tahoe Rim Trail Association to raise over \$50,000 for critical repairs on 19 miles of trail. This included widening and fortifying the trail tread, completing extensive rock work to improve the walking surface for hikers, adding drainages to decrease erosion, and removing over 75 downed trees. Thanks to the generous support of Tahoe Fund donors Gordon and Michele Brown, we doubled every donation to bring this project to life.






PROJECT SPOTLIGHT: DESTINATION STEWARDSHIP PLAN

Taking Better Care of Lake Tahoe

A NEW COLLABORATION OF LAND MANAGERS,

business owners, public agencies and nonprofits—with input from more than 3,000 residents and visitors—developed the region's first Destination Stewardship Plan to better manage tourism and outdoor recreation in the Tahoe Basin.

The Lake Tahoe Destination Stewardship Plan seeks to create a healthy balance among the \$5 billion tourism economy, the local community, and the natural environment. The Tahoe Fund is proud to be the fiscal sponsor of the Destination Stewardship Council which is comprised of more than a dozen partners who are tasked with executing the action items identified in the plan.




PROJECT SPOTLIGHT: PARKING ENFORCEMENT STUDY

Parking Enforcement Study

AS ANYONE who's visited the Lake during peak season knows, finding a parking spot at popular recreation sites can be difficult. As a result, dangerous on-highway double- and tripleparking has become commonplace, a problem exacerbated by inconsistent enforcement across jurisdictions. For example, a parking ticket on one side of the Lake can be hundreds of dollars, and on another, under \$50. With the help of a transportation consultant, the Tahoe

Fund brought two dozen partner organizations together to help craft solutions.

After conducting stakeholder interviews and a nationwide review of best practices, consultants recommended a number of action items that agencies can implement now and in the longer-term to make parking easier and safer for everyone in Tahoe.





THIS YEAR'S PROJECTS

FOREST HEALTH

■ Biomass Utilization Tour

A tour for public agencies that showcased several of the Tahoe region's offtake facilities for woody biomass, which are critical to increasing the pace and scale of forest restoration. This included the new Tahoe Forest Products sawmill in Carson City on Washoe Tribe land.

■ California Conservation Corps (CCC) Bike Shelter

A new bicycle parking shelter at the CCC headquarters to promote emission-free transportation for forestry workers.

■ FireAside

Innovative software for creating and managing defensible space prescriptions that will significantly reduce planning time, and make it easier for both residents and fire districts to mitigate neighborhood fire risk. Philanthropic funding from the Tahoe Fund and Parasol Tahoe Community Foundation made this tool available to every fire district in the Basin.

■ Glenbrook Underground

An effort to reduce fire-starts and increase community resilience by undergrounding power, cable, and telecommunications lines in Glenbrook.


■ Lake Tahoe Community College (LTCC) Forestry & Fire Academy Programs *

Scholarships for students in LTCC's Forestry and Fire Academy programs, plus a grant to support an administrator to ensure student success.

Liberty Utilities Resilience Corridor Fuels Reduction Project

A 1,250-acre fuels reduction project near Tahoe City led by the USDA Forest Service - Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit (LTBMU) and the National Forest Foundation. Tahoe Fund filled a funding gap, which enabled agencies to remove biomass from the forest floor and take it to a nearby wood products facility where it was converted into clean energy.

Science to Action Conference

A multi-day event for public agencies, nonprofits and the science community to better incorporate science into land and lake management work around the Basin.

■ Truckee-Tahoe BurnBot Pilot

A two-phase pilot bringing innovative technology to the Basin to increase the pace and scale of forest restoration. These remote-operated tools allow crews to do 10x the work in a fraction of the time, at a fraction of the cost, more safely, and with less impact to the environment.

■ Washoe Tribe Wildland Firefighter Training ★

A wildland firefighter training for Washoe Tribe members with an emphasis on cultural knowledge and practices. This laid the groundwork for another similar training next year focused on prescribed and culturally-guided fire.

■ Whitebark Pine

An applied research effort with the University of Nevada, Reno to understand the rapid Whitebark Pine mortality in the Basin, and equip land managers with up-to-date data so they can tailor forest health treatments accordingly.

LAKE CLARITY

■ Clean Up the Lake California Hotspots

Scuba divers from Clean Up the Lake continued removing litter from high-volume hotspots identified during The 72-Mile Cleanup.

Deepwater ROV

A remote-operated vehicle built by Restoring the Lake Depths Foundation that can remove litter from parts of the lake that are unreachable by scuba divers, and survey aquatic invasive species like the recently discovered NZ Mudsnails.



Achieve Tahoe Adaptive Summer Programs

■ Motel 6 Acquisition

Support for the California Tahoe Conservancy's monumental acquisition of the former Motel 6 property and surrounding 31 acres within the Upper Truckee River watershed in South Lake Tahoe.

Pope Marsh Aquatic Invasive Species

Eradication of a 1.8-acre Eurasian watermilfoil infestation at Pope Marsh in South Lake Tahoe by the Tahoe Resource Conservation District and LTBMU.

UC Davis State of the Lake Report

An annual report from the UC Davis Tahoe Environmental Research Center that tracks short- and long-term clarity trends in Lake Tahoe.

■ Achieve Tahoe Adaptive Summer Programs ★

This program offers summer activities, such as archery, climbing, hiking, paddling and sailing for people with disabilities and their families.

■ Adventure Risk Challenge (ARC) Community Leadership Program ★

A year-long program empowering underserved high school students through outdoor education and leadership development.

■ Boys & Girls Club of Lake Tahoe Outdoor Recreation ★

Recreation and outdoor adventures for Club kids, including skiing, snowboarding, golf, rock climbing, and more in the South Lake Tahoe area.

■ Girls On the Run Sierras ★

Scholarships for low-income participants in Girls On the Run's after school programming, which focuses on running training and leadership development.

■ Increasing Access on the Tahoe Rim Trail ★

Inclusive resources throughout the Tahoe Rim Trail system, including trailside information and stories in multiple languages, along with free outdoor programming for underserved community members and visitors.

■ Lake Tahoe Destination Stewardship Plan

A new plan developed by more than a dozen partners to better manage tourism and outdoor recreation, and balance the needs of the environment, businesses, visitors, and local communities.

■ Lake Tahoe Wildlife Care Center Explorer Packs

Backpacks filled with resources and tools for the immersive educational programs for kids at Lake Tahoe Wildlife Care Center.

■ McConkey EcoChallenge

A student competition designed to inspire and engage the next generation to help solve the region's environmental challenges.

■ SOS Outreach Mentorship Program ★

A youth mentorship program that brings outdoor recreation opportunities to underserved youth in North and South Lake Tahoe.

Surfaced Art

An art sculpture created from trash removed by scuba divers during The 72-Mile Cleanup. The sculpture is on display outside of the new Tahoe Blue Event Center in South Lake Tahoe.

■ Tahoe In Depth

An environmental newspaper published by the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency.

■ Tahoe's Nature for All ★

Free nature experiences from the Tahoe Institute for Natural Sciences for underserved communities, including young people struggling with mental health issues, survivors of domestic abuse, and low-income families.

■ Take Care Tahoe

New educational messaging campaigns to encourage people to take it slow while driving, wear life vests to avoid the dangers of cold water shock, Drink Tahoe Tap, stay safe in the backcountry, and more.

■ Washoe Tribal Liaison ★

Support for a new Tahoe liaison position for the Washoe Tribe of California and Nevada.





A double outrigger canoe for Lake Tahoe Waterman Foundation's adaptive paddling programs and Mobi-mats to improve beach access for people with disabilities at Watermans Landing.

■ Echo Lakes Restoration

Critical work by the Tahoe Rim Trail Association on 19 miles of trail from Echo Lakes to Lake Aloha in Desolation Wilderness.

Lower Tyrolian Trail

A new reroute built by TAMBA and the Forest Service to move the bottom 0.75 miles of the Tyrolian Trail away from a residential neighborhood to the east side of Incline Creek.

■ Meeks Ridge Trail

A new 4.5-mile trail built by TAMBA that connects Meeks Bay to the Lost Lake Trail, creating a 10-mile loop on the west shore for hikers and bikers.

■ Mt. Tallac Winter Access

Snow plowing, signage and maintenance at the Mt. Tallac trailhead by the Tahoe Backcountry Alliance to help expand winter recreation access.

■ Stateline Lookout Panels

New interpretive panels on the LTBMU's Stateline Fire Lookout Trail in North Lake Tahoe.



Lake Link Electrification

■ Tahoe Area Mountain Biking Association (TAMBA) Trail Crew

Support for TAMBA's professional trail building crew from the Tahoe Fund's Trails Endowment.

■ Tahoe Rim Trail Kiosks

Replacement of old trailhead kiosks around the Tahoe Rim Trail with an improved design and bilingual trail information.

■ Trail Operations Training Program

A new trail training program for TAMBA staff and volunteers hosted by land managers and trail building organizations throughout the region.

■ Parking Enforcement Study

A collaborative effort among 20-plus organizations to develop a regional parking enforcement strategy to alleviate dangerous on-highway parking and congestion.




